APS Young Stamp Collectors Offerings - Janet Houser, Youth Coordinator

"We need more young collectors in our hobby." How many times have you heard that stamp collecting needs more young people to keep the hobby alive?

The American Philatelic Society promotes stamp collecting to youth in many ways. One program — the Young Stamp Collectors of America, YSCA, is devoted to supporting stamp collecting among individual young people, up to age 18. Services and educational opportunities are offered to enhance the collecting enjoyment for beginning collectors, as well as for those who have collected for several years.

New YSCA members receive a membership card, a packet of stamps, and a First Day Cover. In addition, members get the quarterly *YSCA E-newsletter*, a colorful electronic publication with columns on stamp collecting basics and topical, U.S., and worldwide collecting. Fun activities for young collectors are included as well. Other member benefits include online support via email and stamps sent quarterly (including on their birthday.)

Members will find support at monthly e-meetings, courtesy of

the Virtual Stamp Club, at www.virtualstampclub.com. In addition, live-member meetings are held twice a year at APS StampShow and AmeriStamp Expo.

Regular membership in YSCA is open to any person of good character, under age 18, at \$10 per person per year. Family memberships are available for two or more youth in the same household for \$15 per year. A membership application can be found on the APS website at stamps.org/YSCA.

Adults interested in showing their support for youth philately are welcome to join the YSCA as Adult Supporting Members, at an annual rate of \$20.00. We also invite all adult members to offer advice, write articles, share financial and in-kind donations, and participate in volunteer opportunities at the American Philatelic Center and at the APS annual shows.

Other programs the APS offers to support youth include:

- All★Star Stamp Club Program — assists leaders of local, organized youth clubs. stamps.org/All-Star
- Young Philatelic Leaders Fellowship — helps avid young collectors grow in the hobby as

Young Philatelic Leaders Fellowship - Alex Haimann, YPLF Founder

The purpose of the APS Young Philatelic Leaders Fellowship (YPLF) is to seek out and engage the most enthusiastic youth stamp collectors (ages 13-25) in the U.S. Once in the program, the YPLF provides for these young collectors to attend the events and visit the places that make philately exciting including the APS AmeriStamp show, the summer StampShow, the Smithsonian National Postal Museum, and the APS headquarters.

The APS YPLF is in the middle of its fourth class year. Each Fellow chooses one of three tracks (author, dealer, or exhibitor) in which they will complete a number of projects related to that track.

Throughout the course of the year-long fellowship, these youth Fellows interact with a number of adult mentors who guide each Fellow through their chosen track. With eleven graduates and three current Fellows, American philately has laid the roots for a strong and enduring youth philately program designed to prepare the next generation of leaders in organized philately.

The Exhibitor Track of the YPLF has been very exciting for

the four Fellows that have engaged in it since the program's inception. To provide a window into the activities and experiences of an Exhibitor Track Fellow, I would like to tell the story of John Phillips, the 2010-11 U.S. Philatelic Classics Society Fellow.

At the start of his fellowship year, John was a 9th grade student from southern Illinois (near St. Louis). John embarked upon the Exhibitor Track deciding

to greatly improve an existing exhibit, America By Water. The highlights of John's exhibit centered on his 19th century steamboat and inland waterway covers. To fulfill the requirements of this track, John connected with more than a dozen national exhibitors, judges, and other important figures in the philatelic world including John Barwis, C. David Eeles, John Hotchner, Janet Klug, Tom Lera, Dr. Elizabeth Nettles, Ada Prill, and Van Siegling for guidance and other critical assistance in the further development of his exhibit.

In mid-February 2011 (halfway through his fellowship,) John gave a presentation at a Webster Groves Stamp Club meeting about his collecting and exhibiting experiences. The Webster Groves Stamp Club regularly attracts high profile collectors and exhibitors to give presentations at their twice-monthly meetings. John's club presentation can be viewed at www.youtube.com/watch?v=n0J4rqTmXiA.

John's improved exhibit qualified for the 2011 Youth Champion of Champions competition where he received the Reserve CofC Award. Following his graduation from the YPLF in 2011, John continued to work on his exhibit and qualified for the 2012 Youth CofC. John's hard work paid off last summer when he won the 2012 Youth CofC! We are very proud of John's efforts and look forward to seeing him increase his involvement on the exhibiting scene in the years to come.

From Childhood Gift to Lifelong Pursuit - Interview with Janet Klug

Six-year-old Janet was a little jealous when her two older brothers were given stamp collections one Christmas morning. So she waited until her brothers lost interest and then “confiscated” their collections, hiding them under her bed. Once the coast was clear, a lifelong passion was born.

She specifically remembers a Canadian issue, a “pretty lady stamp” of young Queen Elizabeth. On a map, Canada was not far from Klug’s native Ohio, but to the elementary-school student, it was a million miles away. “All of this seemed extremely exotic to me.”

“Children are naturally inquisitive and natural collectors,” she tells people often in her unofficial role as an ambassador for stamp collecting. “All it really takes is to put a

spark in front of them and let them go.”

From 2003 to 2007, Janet served as president of the American Philatelic Society. She was, therefore, a natural

pick when a spot opened on the U.S. Postal Service Citizens’ Stamp Advisory Committee in 2010. Janet serves on the subject subcommittee, which is tasked with distilling thousands of ideas into the small number of stamps released annually.

Janet currently serves as Immediate Past President on the Board of Directors of the American Philatelic Society. There she is helping the Society develop a 20-year plan. She is also a member of the National Postal Museum Council of Philatelists, and continues as a member of the Citizens’ Stamp Advisory Committee.
